### Overview

#### **What to Expect:**

*CEF is a module-based course. You will explore and revisit areas of study in hair, skincare, makeup, nails, health and wellness, and fashion several times. The program of study focuses on introducing and practicing technical skills and professional practices. At each level; 10, 20, 30; the expectations of your knowledge and skill will increase as you gain experience with content and techniques.*

*Theory: Each module requires background knowledge before actual practice begins, so each will include a written theory component.*

*Practice: Physical skills and routines are perfected by repetition; expect to perform the same techniques many times. Every module will have theory, practice, and written and practical examinations.*

**As this class is hands on, you will at times be expected to**

***perform procedures on other students  
and allow others to perform prearranged procedures on you***

**for practice, demonstration, and evaluation purposes.**

***assist with hair and/or makeup with the drama programme (for credit)***

We will be working through a minimum of 3 introductory modules from the Cosmetology, Esthetics, and Fashion streams in each year of study, with flexibility after COS 10 in direct the stream of study to a general focus on all areas or a more directed focus in one stream. Approximately 25 hours of instruction is allotted for each module, and deadlines are set for completion dates for introductory modules to get everyone working with the support instructor in a timely manner.
